True or false: the coronavirus was less a failure of a prediction and more a failure to act upon expert guidance. True. There were actually lots of signs that a pandemic like that was possible, perhaps even overdue, and during the early stages experts gave predictions and advice that weren't followed.

Suppose a political poll says that 71.4% of voters will vote for candidate A, and 28.6% of voters will vote for candidate B. The margin of error on these polls is $\pm 4\%$. How sure should we be that candidate A will win? We should have near 100% certainty that A will win.

Suppose a political forecast gives candidate A a 71.4% chance of winning, and candidate B a 28.6% chance of winning. How sure should we be that candidate A will win? We should be more confident that A will win than B will win, but either one is still very possible.

What was the most important factor about Silver's FiveThirtyEight model that gave Donald Trump a much higher chance of winning in 2016 than nearly any other model of the election? It did not assume that the swing states were independent, since they were so similar demographically.
